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## 1. Introduction of AMIED :

Alwar Mewat Institute of Education & Development (AMIED) was established with the mission ‘to participate in the formation of an egalitarian, progressive and enlightened society by contributing in the process of evolution of a system equitable and quality education and development for all Children’ in 2000. It has been working to meet the educational needs of children especially girls of socially excluded and economically vulnerable communities in rural Rajasthan. The children and young girls are in the centre stage of all interventions of the organization, and core activities address their basic survival and educational needs by adopting child-centric and inclusive approach through creation of social and gender sensitive child-friendly environment. The current focus is to empower adolescent girls through education-based initiative to address age-appropriate educational learning needs by integrating the relevant cross-cutting issues like life skills , reproductive and sexual health and hygiene with the curriculum transaction.

AMIED works through the mechanism of direct intervention, community mobilization, system strengthening, networking and policy advocacy in close partnership with government, civil societies, academic institutions, corporate and the community at large.

**Key strategic interventions:** Community Involvement; Strengthening of Government systems, i.e. schools , health and ICDS centres etc.; adolescents learning centres; residential and non-residential trainings including sessions on gender, early marriage, sexual and reproductive health and rights; continuing education through issue-based short duration trainings; working with grassroot level institutional structures such as PRIs, SMCs / SDMCs and VHSNCs; formation and strengthening of adolescents girls group; organize leadership training of adolescents girls leaders; advocacy and dissemination which focuses on enabling equal access to quality education to children, especially girls in Rajasthan State of India . An important intervention includes action research and documentation through regular feedback and review process.

**Delivery model:** AMIED believes in a systemic participatory approach. It views entire problem in system and believe in working with all the factors/actors responsible for the problem. Apart from working with children, parents, and teachers it also works with Govt officials at various levels, local community people, community-based organizations, religious heads, other Govt. and Non-Govt. agencies working with same aims and objectives.

AMIED works to provide relevant and holistic education to children’s special focus on adolescents especially girls who have remained excluded from school education and health rights. A substantial majority of these girls and young women belonging to the most deprived sections of society viz. Dalits, tribal OBCs and rural Minority communities. It has committed itself to bring about positive changes in the lives of adolescent girls and helping them to overcome social divisiveness on account of caste, colour ,region, religion and gender.

The projects run by AMIED is being supported by Azim Prem Ji Foundation , UNICEF Jaipur ,American Jewis world Service USA , NASIM Foundation USA , Taz and Zakir Syed Family Charitable Foundation USA and community itself. 4. To provide an enabling environment in which the communities can access adequate drinking water for humans and animals within the constraints of environmental equilibrium by leveraging traditional knowledge and appropriate technology.
5. To create an enabling environment in which women's and Girls gets equal rights and opportunities.
6. To Ensure increase participation of adolescents in their life related matters i.e. Sexual and reproductive health, decision making process.
7. To create enabling environment of children to get their constitutional rights.

### Strategy:

The strategies are as follows which AMIED adopts in their projects for achieve the objectives of organisation goal:

- (1) **Work with the community** : It is ,perhaps ,true of all social and human development projects, particularly those which give importance to gender equity , that work with the community has to be the indispensable strategy not only at the initial stages of the project, it has to be sustained till the conclusion of the project. Not only the response of the people, and parents of the persons who are to be educated, depend on it; even more important, sustainability of the project is dependent on active involvement of the community.
- (2) **Creation of people's organizations**: In many situations creation of people's organizations becomes a goal/ objective in itself. Creation of organizations as an important strategy for achievement of the objectives in our projects. We envisage two types of people's organizations ;(a) Community collective at the village level and their collective at the block and district level; and ( b) adolescents /youth forums/collective in villages and , over a period of time , a collective at the block/district level. These organizations, the membership of which would not be confined to one community, would work towards ensuring children's school/college education of all children .
- (3) **Strengthening of Panchayati Raj institutions ( PRIs)**: Proper delivery of government services depends a great deal on effective functioning of PRIs . Long term sustainability of programmes like education is also dependent on PRIs becoming partners in the programme.
- (4) **Gender inclusive approach**: Given the fact that women's exclusion from practically all spheres of life is a common phenomenon, it requires special attention. The inclusion of gender has numerous dimensions. These include women being able to participate in work force without discrimination and receiving equal remuneration; access to education and health care as a right. This can be achieved not only when women are aware of their rights but the larger society also understands the necessity of their participation in the process of social development.
- (5) **Residential / Non-residential education and training**: We give the greatest importance to the process of education becoming a mean for young people to accept equality of persons of different religions and castes. Moreover, our approach is that thorough education young persons are not only to learn and understand certain things, but they must absorb and adopt in their conduct what they learn. These things, which involve change in behaviour, become much more feasible through residential /non-residential education.
- (6) **Institutionalizing the praxis of learning ,action, review and learning**: For improving the efficiency of management and relevance of the educational process it is important to reinforce the cyclical process which envisages  
Learning and reflection--- Field action --- systematic joint review--- Assessment of learning needs -----Learning and reflection----
- (7) **Initiating a process of the long learning**: A corollary of the above referred praxis is that learning of the workers of AMIED and the adolescent persons who are inducted into the programme has to be an on-going process.



Indeed, with time new learning needs will emerge and there will be need for strengthening the system of staff training and continuing education of the participants.

## Thematic area wise progress report in 2023-24

**1 Children's Education:** Children's education is core agenda of AMIED . AMIED firmly believes that education plays a significant role in socio-economic development and cultural enrichment of the society and individuals. We believe in equal opportunity, irrespective of social status, class, caste, religion and gender in all walks of life especially in the realm of education, to ensure non-discriminatory and equal distribution of grains of development especially that of education, and thus Knowledge does not necessarily remain confined to only a privileged few. Our experience of working with educationally backward communities has revealed that there is an urgent need for quality education, health and development for these excluded children. Initiative were supported by, Azim Prem Ji Foundation, American Jewish World Service, UNICEF Rajasthan, NASIM Foundation and Taj and Zakir Syed Foundation USA .

58644 Children specially Girls were benefited who are enrolled in govt.schools /college in above blocks under various projects . Details of Project wise are as under :

### 1. Initiative for Better Tomorrow:

Initiative for better tomorrow is working on education and empowerment of Adolescents Girls to contribute in social transformation through educational and social development. This project is focus on Empowering Muslim and Dalit adolescent's girls through capacity building, also motivating them to complete higher secondary education, decrease early child marriage, gender-based discrimination and Life skills education. Project is supported by American Jewish world service (AJWS) since 2016.This Project is implemented in 25 Village of Kishangarhbas Block of Alwar district of Rajasthan.

**Greatest Success of this year :** Jayda , Nahida,Englisha , Farzana ,Najrana and Sabana were started central and state administrative service preparation from our target area . All of 6 girls belong to our adolescent girls collective and play main leader in collective to associate with girls for education and empowerment. Jayda ,Englisha , Farzana , Najrana and Sabana all 5 are first generation learner in their family. All of six girls started their preparation due to IBT programme intervention supported by AJWS. Jayda marry after 10+2 with her sister and after one year she is widow. After that they work in their village as tutor to educate dropout girls through AGLC and complete her graduation. Currently she enrolled in teaching training course (B.Ed) and want to join administrative service .

All of these girls give direction to other girls who think about their career in a different sector . After shabnam these six girls will be role model of entire area of Mewat . First time these girls prepare administrative service exam conducted by state and central govt through state PSC and UPSC .

This is a historic movement to us that the parents allow to their daughter's for administrative services and allow to stay at district and state capital, In initially they not allowed to send these girls to join for school which is far 500 meter from their home in their respective village .

Now their priority were change sift from marriage to girls career through education and give all opportunities which she want . Mindset of community were change and their effect reflect on girls mobility , their choice , opportunities and plateform which they provide or support .

- Shabnam Engineer were also play the important role to achieve her dream and role model of entire area .

### Activity details of Programme :

Initiative for Better Tomorrow Project engaged adolescent's girls /youth with adolescent's girls through direct intervention i.e. Strengthening of adolescents girls collective in all 25 village with engage of 1350 girls , Associated dropout girls with education through 10 adolescent's girls learning center ,back to school campaign to wider level publicity of girls education , capacity building workshop with adolescents girls leaders on leadership , health , sexual and reproductive health ,life skills etc at block and cluster level.

5 cluster level adolescents girls conclave were also organized to large number of adolescents girls participation, to share each other stories, positive , struggle , success stories and challenge faced etc . These conclave are organized at Baghoda, dhogra, Khohyda Karmali , Ismailpur and Mirjapur . One block level girls conclave were organized at ghasoli on 28<sup>th</sup> Jan. 2024 with 291 girls , community members and stakeholders .

Details of activities which engaged adolescents girls /young people through programme which details are as under :

**1.Adolescents Education and Empowerment:** Adolescents Education and Empowerment is the main head of initiative for better tomorrow in which focus on adolescents Girls education and empowerment, in which lots of activities were conducted in Jan. 2023 to Feb. 2024 . Some of main activities details are as under :

#### 1.1 Girls Conventions on Early Child Marriage and Higher Education:

Girls' convention on child Marriage and Higher Education were organized on 28 feb. 2024 at Ghasoli under the Initiative for better tomorrow. 291 Participant from community, girls collective, community collective, PRIs , community leaders, legislative assembly member, PRIs were participate in the convention .

Journalist, Doctor, Engineer, Lawyer": AMIED's Girls' Convention plants seeds of possibility In a courtyard outside Ghasoli, a small village in rural Mewat, India, about 200 fists shoot into the air. In unison, a mass of adolescent girls shout: "All of us are united! All of us are leaders!"

Educate Mewat! Developed Mewat  
For a region where, just a few years ago, the female literacy rate sat around 10% and the average age of marriage for women was 12-14, such a show of solidarity is nothing short of revolutionary. And the catalyst is AJWS grantee AMIED — a local, grassroots organization that has steadily fought for girls' rights to education in dozens of villages across Mewat for over 22 years. This 'Girls Convention,' held in one of AMIED's education centers, has drawn not only girls in AMIED's network — but parents, local religious and political leaders, and dozens of curious boys, who listen in from the edges of the crowd.

All afternoon, AMIED community leaders — mostly teenage girls and young women — speak about how staying in school instead of marrying early has changed their lives. One group of girls, dressed up in turbans and sitting around a traditional tobacco pipe, role-plays how to have conversations with parents who want their daughters to stop studying and get married. Another calls out what they dream of becoming when their studies are complete: Journalist! Doctor! Engineer! Lawyer!

That these girls are celebrating their own liberation is inspiring, but not surprising. The surprises come from the leaders

— men whose own patriarchal values and views on girls’ education have been transformed by AMIED’s tireless work. “I see AMIED as a honeybee in our community,” says an elderly member of the Mewat village council. “They are spreading education from village to village. And we are seeing the honey today — our girls are more educated; their futures are sweeter.”

“I know that education has the power to stop child marriages. Empowering a young girl to speak up to her family and demand her rights can change the course of her life,” says Naheeda. “If I got married now, my education would stop. That’s no choice for me. I can get married anytime. But my education can’t wait.”

“Every girl deserves an education. It’s education that makes you realize your life is not limited to the four walls of your family home,” she says. “AMIED took me outside what I thought was possible. They are the root of the tree of my life. If AMIED weren’t here, rooting me in what I want and believe, I wouldn’t be standing firmly where I am.” Say Shabnam, first Engineer of Mewat area.

### 1.2. Cluster Level Girls Conventions:

Cluster level girl’s conventions on adolescents girls education and early and forced child marriage were organised under initiative in five cluster level . details are as under

Each Cluster level conventions, Girls collective members from 5-6 village of respective cluster were join in common place and discussed about their education and life related issue. They openly share their issue , strategies to find out the challenges , success stories and discuss on capacity building of collective members in planned way. Career counseling and higher education were also the topic which were discussed in conventions . They demand that community work for create enabling environment of all adolescents’ girls in their respective village and institutions. They also demand to provide equal opportunities by the parents and community members . They feel that due to lack of STEM subject in their villages, all of the girls forcibly taken the humanities subject and due to this lot of opportunities which STEM provide girls are deprived. They plan to Raise this issue with respective authorities and try to open STEM subject in their schools so that girls can benefited with them .

### 1.3 -Leadership and Life skills Workshops of Leader Girls of AGEF.

Two workshop on Leadership and Life skills of leader girls at Sapotra karouli on 12.4 2023 and ghasoli on 25.1.2024 . 79 girls were joining these workshops. Discussion issue of these workshop were leadership, sexual and reproductive health and rights , life skills , higher education as well as self defense . Ms. Ruksana , Ms. Asha Narang , Mr. Jagdish Jat and Mr. Noormohammad were also join these workshop as resource person .Girl leaders Ms. Sunita , Anita , Neelam and Sayra were also present their struggle , success and challenge which faces adolescents and Young Girls .

### 1.4 Strengthening of College Going Girls collective as Leader girls in their community and role model

For strengthening of college going Girls Collective ,Regular Meeting of collective were held at quarterly level for awareness about girls higher education , career counseling and scholarship . Collective also focus on leadership and life skills developed in their members so that they play role model in their community. Leader girls play leadership role at any function organized under programme , they leader the programme , anchoring the programme and share their views about adolescents education and empowerment and attention points of community members regarding enabling environment of girls at school and society .



Due to this Jayda , Nahida and Sabana were start their preparation of Administrative services through UPSC. All of these three girls were first generation learner and first girls who prepare Indian administrative service.

### **1.5 Formation and strengthening of Girls forum at district level:**

District level Adolescents Girls forum /Collective were established in 2023. 30-35 Girls leader become the member of district level adolescents girls /collective and Jayda, Nahida, Shabnam, Shofiya , Farzana and Englisha were the core committee member of district level forum /collective of Rajasthan Rising .District level forum/Collective plan and implement the activities at district and block level and take leadership of the porogramme .

### **1.6 Sessions taken with adolescent Girls groups on Sexual and Reproductive Health:**

1350 adolescent's girls taken part in life skills session taken at village and school level by leader girls and staff in 25 village in this grant period. Life skill session taken on adolescents age, change in the adolescent age, gender discrimination, safe touch and unsafe touch, mensuration circle , mode of information, pressure which adolescents girls face , sexual and reproductive health and rights as well as importance of higher education of girls .

Due to these sessions 120 girls take admission in college education, 155 dropout girls associated with open school board exam , 194 girls associated with adolescents girls education center and 236 irregular or dropout girls reenrolled in school system for continue their education .

**1.7 Providing Educational support to dropout and potential dropout girls:** In this activity we work with two type of adolescents girls i.e. Dropout girls and Potential Dropout girls who enrolled in 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade in govt. schools .

**1.7.1 Adolescents Girls Learning center (AGLC):** 10 Adolescents learning center run in the area for dropout adolescent's girls in their respective village. 294 dropout girls were enrolled in these AGL centers. AGLC run by leader girls of respective village after orientation and training of tutors. These tutors run these centers of 3-4 hours in which 2 hours for subject teaching i.e. Hindi, Maths and English and remaining time they work on creative activities as well as life skills. After foundation course 125 girls associated with Rajasthan open school exam system for 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> exam after 4-5-year dropouts. AGLC provide space for adolescent's girls to discuss their life related issue and their own space where they talk/ discuss which they want.

### **1.7.2 Working with Potential Dropout Boys and Girls:**

Potential dropout's boys and girls in grade 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of govt. schools who irregular, not completed their homework, week in math's, science and English and not having any support structure at home for subject specific support their home because of first generation learner. In this project period we work with 7 govt. schools where our tutor work for subject specific support in govt. schools from Jan to March 2023 as well as in Dec. to March 2024 . Tutor work with the potential dropout children for specific and selected topics as per syllabus of BSER. Strategically we work with the simple to hard exercise with the potential dropout children. 187 students benifited from this activity .

**1.8 Celebration of National Girls Child Day:** Celebration of National Girls child day were celebrated on 11 oct. 2023 at Medabas in Kishangarhbas block with 35 leader girls and women's .Girls Leader discuss on girls higher education , career counseling and opportunities for their dreams . They demand STEM subject in their schools so that girls can participate in science related opportunities in their life . Girls leader also discuss on the Important of National Girls Child day and their theme of 2023 .

**1.9 Survey Conducted on Early Child Marriage in lockdown:** Banglore team conducted early and forces marriage study in our project area on 10-11 oct. 2023 in Medabas , Padasla and Baghoda . They meet with 25 leader girls and fill up the survey form of effect on lock down in the sector of child marriage. Ms. Aneela banglore were conducted this study.

**1.10 Good touch and Bed Touch workshop with govt. schools Children:** Good touch -Bed Touch workshop were conducted in Govt. sr. secondary school Mushkheda Kishangarh bas of Principal Secretary Mr. Navin Jain order a campaign on 28 Oct. 2023 in School campus .. 195 girls and boys were attend the workshop and learn about good touch and bed touch . safe touch give us good feelings, to make you feel warm, comfortable and safe inside and A touch for me is when someone gives me a hug to say hello.

Bad touch or Unsafe touch means sad, frightened, unloved , unwanted , A touch does not feel good , it may make uneasy or bothered inside .

A touch for me is when someone pinches me on purpose. You are the master of your body. Always use three principals when you feed bad or unsafe touch

1.Say No 2. Run and 3.Escape and 4. Sought/Scream

And how to report urgently etc. were discussed properly with the joined children's .

**1.11 Library cum Resource Center :** Library and resource books were purchased under this head to provide support of girls who prepare competitive exam and learning center girls for develop reading habits .These books uses by leader girls to supplement in their study .

**1,12 Media Workshop:** Media workshop with Leader Girls were organized on 10-11 June 2023 and 22-23 July 2023 at Agarwal Dharmshala Alwar. Ms. Tabeena Anjum , Consultant of UNICEF take resource person role in the both of the workshops . 10 leader girls from IBT area were join these workshop i.e Jayda , Muskan , Dhilsana , Tarlila , Aarti , Taslima , Englisha , Suhana , Nahida and Saniya from 9 villages of IBT Project area .After these two workshop leader girls prepare magazine namely ' They Inspire '

They learn about , how to prepare newspapers , their pattern and matter as well as Body parts name of News papers .

**2. Community Mobilization and their involvement in Girls Education:** For Community Mobilization and their involvement in girls' education lot of activities were conducted in this grant period. Some of the main activities are as under:

**2.1 House hold Survey :** House hold survey are the main activity of community mobilization and awareness about girls education on mass level . In April to June 2532 House hold survey were conducted in 10 villages of our target area covering 13420 population including 7037 male and 6389 female . Sex ratio of these families is 907 and average family size of these families is 5.3 . 5 out of 10 villages are new village of this survey .

In these families nearabout 89% children are out of Preschool Facilities .74.84 girls joining schools of 6-14 age group and 70.26% girls belong to 11-20 year age group are associated with education system. Mainstream of Out of schools

/dropout girls we run Adolescents girls learning center or mainstreaming through open school board rajasthan . 236 students reenrolled into school again with community mobilization .

**2.2. Peoples Convention on Adolescents Girls Education and Empowerment :** District level peoples convention on adolescents' education and empowerment were organized at Mahavar Auditorium on 8 oct. 2023 at alwar. 195 including 110 adolescents girls out of 850 total participant were participate from Initiative for Better Tomorrow Kishangarh bas Alwar. Mr. Tika ram July , MLA RURAL , Alwar and Mr. Deep chand Khariya , MLA, Kishangarh bas along with Mr. B.P. Suman , Mr. Akram Syed, Founder of NASIM Foundation USA , Ms. Archana Relan , APJ Foundation , Mr. Sokat Ali , Retd. Additional divisional Commissioner , Govt. of Rajasthan etc were join as guest of the convention .

Girls' leader shares their experience, struggle, success of her journey and want to attention of community leaders to provide opportunities through education for better tomorrow. Girls who prepare CA, UPSC, Delhi police , teacher , nursing and technical courses were share their experience . Some of the girls who again mainstreaming into education through open school board also share their experience, how they again associated with education after 4-5 years dropout.

Shabnam , resident from Mahua khurd demand to cabinet minister Mr. Tika Ram July to science stream in her village school , she share that lack of science stream maximum girls taken of humanities subject because parents were not allow them to go outside to study science stream , Due to this lot of opportunities were left from girls . Chief Guest Mr. Akram syed , share story of him struggle and opportunities in and outside india if we focus on our education . Due to education, he is at this stage and support thousands of students to complete their education. He is very happy to AJWS work effect on girls as well as community.

**2.3 Capacity Building workshops with Community based groups:** Capacity Building workshop of Community based group known as Shiksha Panchayat were organized on 31 Oct. 2023 at Kishangarh bas and 18 feb 2024 at Gasoli and 49 and 56 members of shiksha panchayat were join these workshops. 46 out of school girl's documents were prepared by shiksha Panchyat member in their respective villages. Shiksha Panchyat members Provide space for adolescent's girls learning center and selection of tutors.

**2.4 School Management Committee /SDMC Chairperson meeting on Girls Education and safe and secure environment of girls at schools and society:** School Management Committee members workshop were organized on 27 Oct. 2023 at Kishangarh bas in which 37 members and 19 Feb 2024 at Ghasoli in which 58 members of SMC/SDMCs were join from 25 villages on Girls education and enabling environment at school and society . SMC /SDMC chairperson share their experiences regarding their role and keen to know about how they play more role in school management . Resource person share govt. rules In this regard and motivate to members to know their rights and procedure to manage effectively SMC and their role . All children's belong to their respective village are associated with the education either school or open board system .

**2.5 Open School Awareness Campaign :** For Increase awareness about open board examination in the target area , Open awareness campaign were organized in all 25 villages in August 2023 on 13-14 August 2023 . Pumptlets of open school board were circulated into community members and streat meeting were organized in all the villages related to association of open board school . 152 Boys and 198 Girls total 350 out of school identify during the campaign . Mike were use for awareness about the open board school system as well as pumptlets also give to them for further more inquiry.

**2.6 Shiksha Panchayat Meetings at Village Level :** Village level Shiksha Panchayat meetings were continuously organized for increase involvement of community members in girls education , create support system for safe and enabling environment of girls in their community . 68 meetings organized at village level in which 1043 members participated and associate with girls education and empowerment in their respective village /community for create enabling environment .

**Engagement with Stakeholders :**

**1.Engagement with Community Members including Family Members:** Community Engagement as well as create enabling environment in society and institutions for adolescent's girls' education and empowerment. Village level meeting with shiksha Panchayat and community members were organized regularly at village level . Details of village level meetings are as under

**2.Engagement with Schools and Govt. Institutions:** During the project period team regularly contact with School principals and teachers for girls education and empowerment . Mainstreaming of 226 girls through enrollment campaign were possible due to school support . Enrollment campaign were conducted with the support with the school management . Life skills sessions with 8<sup>th</sup> to 12 girls students at school level were possible with active partnership with school administration . Panchyat Extension Education officers were coordinated with all activities at their panchayat level.

**3. Interface of Adolescents Girls leaders with Govt. officials regarding their issue regard to education, Health and gender-based discrimination:** Interface of 20 adolescents Girls leaders were conducted with District collector Khairtal , SP Khairtal , SDM Kishangarh bas, Pradhan and SHO Kishangarh bas on 14 Sep. 2023 at district headquarter Khairtal .Girls belong to Mirjapur , Medbas, Dhamukarh , Jeelota ,shyamaka , Mothuka , and Ranoli of this delegation .

Girl Leaders share their stories with district collector Dr. Omprakash Berva regarding their struggle, dream, success and challenges. They demand to DM to open STEM stream in Mewat area schools. Sapna , Rajbala from padasla raise this issue as well as public transport to join college or higher education . DM Berva listen all the girls and share own story to become DM . They share that he is belong to farmers family and only education is the thing which provide this opportunity. So that all of you do hard work with clear vision and if any need from us , we are with you .DM directed to Education officer to sift open exam center from alwar to Kishangarh bas for more convenience of girls to sit in the exam .

Block Pradhan Mr. B.P.Suman share the Panchayat raj institutions process and election process of Pradhan as well as work responsibilities .ADM Omprakash Shaharan motivate the girls to do hard work and become role model of their village to promote other parents to educate their girls .He describe the preparation pattern to fight state or central administration services .

Girl leader feel very happy to interact with these block and district level officer and know about their role and responsibilities as well raise their issue with them for resolve to education of all adolescents girls belong to Mewat area .

**4.Stakeholder Meeting at Block level for networking and sensitization on adolescent's girls' education and Empowerment.**

Stakeholder meeting at block level were organized at Kishangarh bas on Feb. 2024 . 35 Participants from PRIs , school administration , Religious leaders, Block Pradhan and Parents along with leader girls . Discussion issue of meetings are how to create enabling environment of Adolescents Girls Education and Empowerment and how to Provide equal opportunities to adolescents Girls so that they also play Role model in their communities. Girl leaders also demand to STEM subject in their respective villages and public transport from their village to block for regular attending the college .

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### **Learning :**

We learned a lot of from this programme in this year and last years . We part of these activities/strategies in all our existing /new programme .UNICEF listen to us about these strategies /activities which engage in education of dropout / potential dropout girls as well as strengthening capacity of these children's through life skills sessions. They are study of this model and want to implement in whole of the Rajasthan though this model to mainstream dropout and potential dropout children's specially girls . We prepare package for this and share with govt. of Rajasthan thorough UNICEF to scaleup in whole part of Rajasthan .

### **Results /Outputs :**

Due to above work adolescent's girls negotiate with their parents regarding their education and mobility. They start interact with their parents of their life related decisions and take part in it. Girls raise their issue on the common platform with the community leaders and demand to create enabling environment for adolescent's girls at society and institutions. They raise their discriminate related issue with the community as well as opportunities. The Girls leader denial their marriage proposal and demand the opportunities of higher education. In this year 120 girls take admission in higher education institute i.e. colleges. Girls leader organized their girls convention on fully ownership They share the dice with the community members and address the gathering with their issue, success and challenges.

Some of the changes /progress are shown are as under:

- 120 girls take admission in higher education after 10+2 from our 25 village.
- 155 dropout girls mainstreaming into education after 3-5 years through open school system.
- 194 dropout girls associated with Adolescent's girls learning center in 10 village and take part in educational activities as well as life skills session for empowerment.
- 1350 adolescent's girls take part in life skills sessions at village /schools' level and learn life skills who are belong to adolescent's girls collective.
- 236 girls mainstream into schools' education system through back-to-school campaign.
- 3 girls prepare administration services and 15 girls prepare Rajasthan /delhi police force.
- Adolescent's girls use sanitary pad in monthly period time openly and motivate to others girls to use it for safety without any hesitation.
- Girls' mobility was increase and they come out to home for complete their higher education or preparation of competitive Examination.
- 20 Girls Interact with District and block level officers and PRIs on the issue of adolescents girls education and empowerment.
- 11 leader girls participate in Media sensitization workshop organized by UNICEF Consultant and release Girls news latter " They Inspire" with their writeup/stories .



- Leader girls take leadership and intervene in their life related issue i.e. marriage choice , education , views of issue related to their life and parents and community members listen to them and accept that lack of opportunities and support girls lack behind , Now they required more support so that they find equal opportunity for better tomorrow .
- Due to Life skills session girls know about their body , discuss about the menstruation cycle , use sanitary pad and motivate to other girls and women's to use it for safety . Now the taboo and myths about the menstruation cycle they know scientifically about it and aware other girls in their community .
- Girls leader denial their child marriage and give preference to connect higher education to change their life .

## **2. Initiative for Education and Empowerment of Adolescents Girls: Supported by Azim Prem Ji Foundation Bangalore**

Initiative for Education and Empowerment of Adolescents girls is implemented in 50 village of 24 village Panchyat having 24 sr. secondary and 26 upper primary schools as well as 45 Aganwadi centers of Tijara Block in Alwar District. Project area of Tijara block in Alwar district is characterized by most backward almost in all human development indicators such as predominance of a socially excluded and economically vulnerable Meo Muslim community with patriarchal society, low female literacy and high gender gap in education, low sex ratio, high prevalence of early and forced child marriage and poor functioning of government school system, as reflected from various surveys and studies. The area of operation especially the Mewat region witnesses the gender discrimination which is evident in every aspect of life of the girls. They are deprived of education, forcibly married at tender age, deprived of proper nutrition and often subjected to violence and abuse. The acute poverty adds salt to injuries thus making the lives of girls miserable.

Target 50 villages divide into 5 clusters , each cluster having 10 villages for smoothly implementation of Project activities .Each cluster have two staff members in which one is compulsory of women staff .Project coordinator, Academic Coordinator and Community coordinator are sitting at block level office to coordinate , management and monitor of all activities for achieving the project objectives .Project office is set up at Block headquarter of Tijara Block .

Currently 17229 Children's in all 50 govt. schools in which 8505 students enrolled in grade 1 to 5 , 5733 students enrolled in grade 6 to 8<sup>th</sup>, 1921 Students enrolled in grade 9<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> and 1070 students enrolled in grade 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> .Data show that 49.36% students in grade 1 to 5 , 33.27% students in grade 6 to 8 , 11.14% students in grade 9<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> and 6.21% students enrolled in 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade which show that transition rate is very poor . Maximum students dropout after middle class .

**Goal of the Project:** The over-arching goal of the project is to empower adolescent girls of 10-23 years of most vulnerable section of the rural society by ensuring them quality education through positive social change in 50 villages of Tijara block in Alwar district.

### **Objectives of the Projects :**

1. To build enabling gender sensitive, child-friendly and non-discriminatory social environment for girls' education in rural community and schools.
2. To impart age-appropriate learning competencies / skills to 850 out-of-school adolescent girls and 80% of them are to mainstream in age appropriate grade for completion of school education. All of these girls belong to 10-18 age group i.e. Middle and secondary age groups .
3. To provide academic support to 750 low performing girls who will be enrolled in xth grade , especially at risk of failure for their secondary level education by organizing remedial classes to improve their study and

examination skills and link them with public examination system through secondary board or open school system.

4. To impart life skills and leadership development to 3000 adolescent girls (aged 10 to 18 years) and strengthening their Kishori Manchis (Adolescent girls forums which will be formed under project) in at least 80% of the project villages for establishing dignity of girls and women in rural society.
5. To work towards policy reformation supportive to deprived girls and women through networking and advocacy with key stakeholders (influencing persons, government, CSOs, youth and women's groups).

5. 30 Shiksha Mitra (Tutors) work with the adolescent's girls for teaching learning process as well as life skills in AGLC.
6. 248 Dropout adolescents girls belong to 33 village associated with Rajasthan Open school system for secondary and senior secondary level examination due to motivation and support of field staff in which 201 girls associated with secondary and 47 girls associated with senior secondary exam from open school board Rajasthan . All of these adolescents girls dropout 4-5 years from school education due to various reasons .
7. 113 girls and 111 boys of potential dropout associated with remedial classes organized at 10 sr. secondary school for better performance in English , Maths and Science in subject specific tutorial support .

8. 218 students pass out of 224 students of our remedial classes in secondary board exam. 98.46% of tutorial girls clear their secondary board exam due to our support. Schools those have not any subject teachers i.e science, maths and English they have poor result.
9. 384 teachers including 118 female teacher have sensitized on girls education, gender equity and safe and secure environment in their institutions through 65 school level meeting with school staff.
10. Kishori Manch( Adolescents Girls Forum ) formation is completed in all 50 villages having 3531 members.
11. 552 AGF meetings organised at village level in which 12349 adolescents girls participated.
12. 263 adolescents girls take part in ARSH and girls education training workshop.
13. 111 leader girls from 50 village attend leadership development workshop.
14. 5 Cluster level federation were form of Adolescents girls in which 150 girls were active members.
15. 172 Application form received from Girls who apply for scholarship for completing their higher education, integrated, technical and professional courses in which 106 girls are new and 66 girls are old girls who received last year scholarship from project till August.
16. Increase awareness about girl education and their rights among adolescents girls and they raise issue in front of their parents, stakeholders to fulfil their demands.

### **Success Story :1**

#### **Open board center shifts from District to Block level**

Rajasthan Open school board were order that contact camp of open secondary and senior secondary girls were conducted kishangarh bas block which is 15 km from Block headquarter of Tijara and 30-45 km from our working villages. Girls share this problem in Adolescents girls group that their parents are not agree to send kishangarh bas block to attend contact classes for 15 days. Why not this camp were organised at our block Tijara. After the discussion girls leader decide that they raise this issue with administration at block and district level to change the center location. 50 girl's leaders with open girls meet with SDM and raise this issue and demand to change the center because all of them are not able to join contact camps in another blocks. SDM Tijara call the Block level education and give direction to write letter to open school board to change the center. IInd group of leader of Rajasthan rising associated with tijara leader girls and raise this issue with DM Alwar Mr. Jitendra Kumar soni and demand to change the center.

DM alwar understand the issue and write letter to Open School Board rajasthan to change the contact class camp vanue and exam center. After the intervention of DM, Open school board Jaipur change the contact camp and exam center from kishagarh bas to Tijara due to adolescents girls initiative.

### **Success Story -2**

#### **Start Again my study after Marriage due to AMIED Support**

I passed my 10<sup>th</sup> board exam through open school board rajasthan after 7 year of marriage. I am very happy. I fill the 12<sup>th</sup> board exam this year from open school board and want to become a teacher in my life. These word of Ms. Janista belong to Neemli and married in Roopbas village. I dropout from my native village school due to non-functional of our village school.

I regularly attend the meetings held in my village under the project and aware about open school board, due to continues support of AMIED staff my family members agree to continue my study through open school. I fill the 10<sup>th</sup> board form and cleared the exam in first attempt. I give the messege in community that education of girls is very

important through my journey .I try that each and every girls engage with education with my support . If I can do it each and every girls can .

### **Success Story -3**

#### **Emerge Leadership due to connect with Education through Adolescent's girls Group**

My name is sundara belong to Lapala village of tijara block which is 14km from block headquarter. Before 3 years I dropout my study from school education . Due to Association with AGLC ( Adolescents girls learning center) and AGF( Adolescents Girls Forum ) I aware my study , I fill the form of 10<sup>th</sup> board exam from open school board rajasthan and passed with 59% marks . Now I fill my 12<sup>th</sup> board exam form from open school board and prepare it with the help of AGLC lapala . I am a leader girl of my village and take life skill session with AGF . Now due to increase awareness of open board exam system , I motivate 4 other girls of my village to fulfil the 10<sup>th</sup> board exam form from open school board this year .

I have develop my leadership quality due to association with AGF and different type of training organised by organisation under the programme . My whole family is very happy with my achievement. I thanks to AMIED and APF to support us for our education and empowerment.

### **Success story -4**

#### **Shabnam Continue her Education due to AMIED and APF Support**

I dropout from school after 9<sup>th</sup> grade due to fear of safety by my parents . I associate with Adolescents girls group and engage with education through AGLC. Due to life skills session attend by me in AGF I want to continue my study through open school board. I fill 10th board exam form and due to hard work I cleared my 10<sup>th</sup> board exam . After that parents are agree to continue my education but they denial to give my fees amount . I think I again dropout at this stage . I raise this issue with project team and request to give my fees so that I complete my 12<sup>th</sup> board exam . AMIED and APF support my board fees and due to this I able to complete my 12<sup>th</sup> board form from open school board rajasthan .

Due to join every meeting, I develop my leadership, I raise my concern and increase my understanding about my body and life. Earlier my parents were not ready to continue my school education within my village , now they permit to me to attend block and district level meetings .

### **Success Story -5**

#### **I do my postgraduation from APU Banglore /Bhopal -Parvida**

When I visit Azim Prem Ji University Bhopal and know about the procedure of admission and facilities provided by APU , I decided to do my MA from APU Banglore or Bhopal. Say Parvida from Fullabas village of tijara block . Parvida , A leader girls of Adolescents girls group of Fullabas and Persue her BA final year this year . Parvida and other 4 leader girls attend the training at Bhopal organised by APF of their partner leader girls from 2 to 8 July 2023 at Eklawya Sansthan .

Parvida father Tahir is a small shopkeeper and want to educate of their children. But neighbours oppose our education and raise the issue with our parents and pressure to stop their girl's education. In this journey AMIED support our dreams. My Father is active member of Mewat Shiksha Panchyat and support girls to continue their education at higher level. AMIED give me scholarship for complete my graduation.

I take part in each and every meeting, Bhopal training change my mindset that why I take consent my family that I want to continue my MA from APU. I need support in preparation of entrance examination of APU so that I cleared this and take admission.

My leadership quality and life skills improve through the continues participation in organisational meetings. I understand my Body and decisions related to my life. My family give permission me to take part in Bhopal training of 7days, this is big change. Earlier we were not allowed to go to outside of village. A lot of adolescent's girls continue their higher education due to AMIED and APF supported initiative.

### **Success story -6**

#### **I and my sister both started again my study due to support of AMIED and APF-Dilsana**

After completion of my 12<sup>th</sup> grade and My sister completed 10<sup>th</sup>, Family members stop our study and want to involve household work and start preparation of our marriage. I took part in life skills session in our school, taken by AMIED and APF staff. I have in depression and negative idea come in my mind. I want to continue my education but family members were not allowed. I call to Project staff for support me and talk to my father for continue my study. AMIED and APF staff again and again visit my home and talk to my family. In this period we have faces violence from our family members that why you call to AMIED staff. They discuss my parents about scholarship programme of project in which Dilsana is entitle of scholarship. After that my father agree to continue our education. Now I take admission in Graduation course and my sister Anjum fill the form of 12<sup>th</sup> from open school board rajasthan.

If AMIED staff not visit again and again my home and discuss about various dimensions of girls education and support structure under project, it is not possible to restart me and my sister education. Thanks a lot. A lot of girls are same situation in mewat area and they need support from organisation so that they continue their education.

I continue do my struggle and complete my goal, which is learn through life skills sessions and leadership development workshop.

### **3. Child Line 1098 Sub Center Sapotra : Supported by CHILDLINE India Foundation New Delhi**

CHILDLINE 1098 is a phone number that spells hope for millions of children's across India. It is a 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, free, emergency phone service for children in need of aid and assistance. CHILDLINE 1098 is a service of Ministry of Women and Child Development. Child Line India Foundation is a non government organisation (NGO) in India that operates a telephone helpline called Childline, for children in Distress. Childline 1098 provides help, support and counselling services to children (18 years and under) and /or young people through online and offline means of communication.

Child Line Sub center sapotra Karouli supported by Child Line India Foundation from Oct. 2020. Child line 1098 supported by Child Line India Foundation and Ministry of Women and Child Welfare Govt. of India. During April 23 to Oct.2\3 a lot of work done by the project team for Child Protection issue in Sapotra Block of Karouli district of Rajasthan.

Details of the work are as under :-

**1.Total Number of Cases Received:** 43 cases received from 1098 regarding child protection issue of sub center in which 1 cases related to medical help, 3 of child marriage, 1of corporal punishment and 38 are related to others. 30 cases

received from outreach activities. One FIR loaded by child line team , 1 cases present in CWC and One case informed to CWCs. Total 73 cases received of sub center in which 43 from 1098 Number and remaining 30 from outreach activities.

#### 4.Mewat Academy of School Education:

**Introduction:** Mewat Academy of School Education (MASE): Mewat Academy of School Education run by Alwar Mewat Institute of Education and Development (AMIED) since 2015. MASE having senior secondary level (10+2) affiliation with Education Department, Govt. of Rajasthan and affiliated with Board of Secondary Education, Ajmer Rajasthan with having stream of Science, Commerce and Humanities (Arts) as on 2019 having 21 subject . Arts stream started from 2019 in MASE Students. Science stream were not possible to us due to Science Lab i.e., Physics, Chemistry and Biology Lab in our school which was high demand from students and communities.

A well-established computer room, science and Maths lab and Library are also set up in school Buildings. 23 rooms , 4 Big halls and separate toilets for Boys and girls as well as sports ground are available as infrastructure . A well-trained qualified teachers of each subject for each medium is available for teaching learning process. Smart class and STEM lab material for also available for our students in which students clear about their doubts and increase their understanding

about Science , Technology and Maths. For digital learning, a software also available from Hyderabad based company Nextzen software company .

Mr. shaharukh Khan managed of whole MASE routine work and Ms.Neema is playing the role of principal. Whole campus is covered by CCTV Camera and electricity purpose solar plant installation with electricity connection. MASE have 425 students including 250 girls. ## SCIENCE and Computer lab Established in Mewat Academy : Supported by NASIM Foundation

**Mewat Academy of School Education (MASE):** Mewat Academy of School Education run by Alwar Mewat Institute of Education and Development (AMIED) since 2015. MASE having senior secondary level (10+2) affiliation with Education Department, Govt. of Rajasthan and affiliated with Board of Secondary Education, Ajmer Rajasthan with having stream of Science, Commerce and Humanities (Arts) as on 2019. Arts stream started from 2019 in MASE Students. Science stream were not possible to us due to Science Lab i.e., Physics, Chemistry and Biology Lab in our school which was high demand from students and community's is senior secondary (10+2) standard school provided for quality education of Deprived children belong to Mewat area of Alwar Districts have 425 students including 250 girls. This Year MASE started Science Stream due to support of NASIM Foundation .

All of these circumstances MASE administration take decision to start science (Medical and non Medical ) , Commerce and Humanities stream – All subject for wider opportunities of students choice and further career. We have received permission from Education Department and Board of secondary Education Ajmer Rajasthan to run these streams and subjects in MASE Institute.

### 6. STEM Education : Supported by NASIM Foundation USA

With the support of NASIM Foundation Science Labs including Physics , Chemistry and Biology Lab were established in 2022-23 in Mewat Academy of School Education Ghansoli Kishangarh bas . In 2023-24 we established of computer lab , solar panel and Digital Board in 2 classrooms of Mewat Academy for digital access of Mewat academy Children . Due to shortage of electricity , solar panel are very useful for proper classes, uses of computer classes as well as digital access and classes by expert on children's syllabus .

## 7. Shiksha avom Sureksha Initiative : Supported by UNICEF Rajasthan

Rajasthan has shown great journey in achieving target for access to education through opening of schools, transport vouchers and residential schools. However, the universalization of education at and above the upper primary stage remains an unfinished agenda. The school closures in 2020 and 2021 have also aggravated the challenge by widening



the existing inequalities. The impact of covid and subsequent school closure can be assessed with the following evidence of UDISE 2020-2021 and 2021-22–

- The Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) declined by 5.7% at the secondary level.
- The transition rate from elementary to secondary declined by 2%.
- The dropout rate increased 2.5% at the primary level and 1.7% at the upper primary level.
- The retention rate at the secondary level declined by 4.5% at the secondary level.

This gives an overview of the scale of the challenge. Besides, the existing strategies to address the learning and developmental needs are yet not sufficient. Furthermore, after-covid what would work the best with OoSC is still not explored by the state and development partners. Adding to this limitation, the learning of the state on working with older OoSC (15 to 18 years) is quite new under samagra shiksha and has very limited learning to respond to their demands in a comprehensive manner. OoSC at higher grades is a huge challenge. One of the barriers to enrolling older OoSC is the accuracy of data on OoSC in the age group of 15 to 18 years. Various sources estimate differently, the NSSO study in 2018 estimates nearly 15 lakh OoSC whereas the state identifies only 0.79 lakh OoSC in the same age group through an annual household survey (OOSC Reporting Tool, Feb 2023). The current status of OoSC reporting tool identifies 4,816 children in the age group of 15 to 18 years eligible for open schooling. Boys in 15 to 18 years age group are distinctly more than girls. Another challenge with older OoSC is, engaging them in meaningful learning opportunities which enables them to be ready for future life. Currently, the department provides financial support of Rs. 2000/- per child to pursue education through RSOS. All girls are being benefitted through DoWE and boys from deprived sections, i.e. SC, ST, Minority and CWSN are also being supported under this provision of Samgra Shiksha. But there is no handholding/ learning support for these OoSC, hence, it is difficult for them to overcome the learning and environmental barriers and continue education.

The situation is worst in backward geographies, Mewat region of Alwar and Dang region of Karauli (aspirational district) are considered socially, educationally and economically most backward areas of the state. The dang area of eastern Rajasthan is largely known for underdevelopment and spread along riverine of Chambal River in Dholpur, Karauli, Sawai Madhopur, Bharatpur. Similarly, Mewat region is dominated by Mewat Muslims, spread in Alwar, Bharatpur and parts of Haryana. Education of girls in this area is a long-standing challenge, where the transition of girls above upper primary is still uncommon. As per UDISE data, GER in both districts has declined at the primary and the secondary level, and 80% at the secondary level for both districts and 77 & 74% for Alwar and Karauli. The dropout rate has two-fold increased at the primary, upper primary and secondary levels. This has reported 2.5% at PS, 4% at UPS, 3% at secondary and 9% at senior secondary level in Alwar and 6%, 3.7%, 5.3% and 9.8% respectively for Karauli district. Besides above, low community and parental awareness on education, gender-biased social norms and community behaviour, lack of teachers, inadequate capacities of teachers, poor capacity of Madarsa teachers, the low transition of children from Madarsa to school, and limited partnerships, alliances, for a common purpose, are common challenges in this region.

In this context, it is critical to innovate to find flexible strategies to work with older OoSC and potential dropout children. This would subsequently strengthen the government system to address their dropouts and retention of children in school. At the same time, the approach would be socially contextual and gender inclusive, addressing predominantly girls from SC, OBC and Minority communities, which constitutes a large share amongst OoSC. Looking at the Muslim minority, their percentage in enrolment consistently decreased from primary at 10.8 % to 6.4% at the senior secondary level. With this backdrop, UNICEF Rajasthan is focusing on finding flexible and alternative solutions to address OOSC and in-school children at risk of OOS. While giving attention to vulnerability, Muslim minorities and SC & OBCs, especially girls, an intervention is proposed to pilot in two geographical locations – Alwar and Karauli.

Alwar is a district situated in the north west of Rajasthan. The social fabric of the villages of the district is heterogeneous in nature with 8.02% of Schedule Tribe, 18 % of Schedule Caste and 14.8% of Meo Muslim communities who have a

poor record of education. The adult sex ratio at 895 and child sex ratio at 865 is alarmingly low in comparison to state and country average (Census of India, 2011). This indicates that male bias still persists in the society which negatively impacts the status of girls and women. This preference for boys over girls is also reflected in other development parameters. The literacy rates that of females in rural areas of Alwar is 52.1% which is lower as compared to males 82% (Census, 2011).

Karuli is one of the backward District. Gender Gap of the literacy rate is 32.8 percent in the district. Low value of girl child considered '*paraya dhan*' (other's wealth) has significantly reduced the probability of higher education and livelihood opportunities for them expediting early marriage. The district has a low female literacy rate (53.23%) as compared to males (75.90%) – (India – 58.8%). High incidence of drop-out beyond Grade 8 – access to secondary schools becomes increasingly difficult. Though the women play important role in household economy - yet have little role in financial decisions. Financial literacy is also generally low among communities. There is an immense need to work with the girls' especially in their formative years. The district Karauli has 1047 government schools with 177 in Sapotra block alone. The enrolment of girls exceeds that of boys however the completion rate for girls' is much lower as compared to boys'. 49.8% in Karouli were married before the age of 18(NFHS-4). Karouli was identify one of the aspirational district ( most underdeveloped district ) by Niti Ayog New delhi .

With consistent efforts of the State government and supportive policy environment school enrolment has increased and the gap between availability of schools and their demand is gradually closing. However what remains dismal are the learning level of children and protection issues of children specially with girls. NAS 2021 report indicates that not even 50% children in class VIII have proficient level in language , Mathematics. This demand for extra support and remedial education. . There are some more challenges like sschool environment (physical infrastructure and child friendly teaching practices including use of corporal punishment), lack of trained teachers, unavailability of learning resources and poor participation of communities, parents and School Management Committees/PLCPC in school planning, management and monitoring lead to poor learning outcomes and high dropout rates among children and especially among girls. So AMIED aim to demonstrate a school and community led participatory and collaborative approach for a holistic school experience for children. Enhancing learning outcomes (language and numeracy) will be the primary objective. Strengthening stakeholder engagement from the school (teachers, PLCPC) to the district level will lend a new rigor to their role in schools further contributing to creating a child friendly, supportive learning environment.

UNICEF has worked with AMIED in 20 villages of the Mewat region of Alwar covering both strategies – out-of-school girls and in-school potential OoS children. This cover – (1) running girls' camps and preparing them for open school, and (2) transacting a package for potential OoS but in-school children enabling them to successfully complete their 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> board examinations. AMIED provided tutorial support to potential dropouts in grades 9 and 10 for acquiring class-appropriate competencies and running adolescent learning centres for out-of-school girls. Based on the previous interventions with adolescents in and out of schools, besides learning support, the need to support adolescents required support in the prevention of rampant abuse and exploitation of girls and enable the building of a safe and protective environment for children.

In this backdrop, UNICEF aims to continue and expand the partnership with AMIED to work in Mewat and Dang region, i.e. selected areas of Alwar and Karauli. The partnership will enable to co-create a model for the state, which can respond to the educational and protection needs of OOSC in ages of 15 to 18 years. UNICEF will focus on system strengthening by -

- demonstrating learning support of OOSC for open schooling,
- explore flexible & innovative strategies for special training, and
- extend remedial learning support in school for potential dropout students

- integrate issues of child rights and protection in the learning package and strengthen existing school and community-based platforms to empower vulnerable children
- create positive and enabling environment by engaging community and parents

#### Implementation Strategy & Technical Guidance:

#### Overall Objective

An enabling ecosystem for quality education and protection for children with a focus on the potential dropout and dropout adolescent girls of the Mewat region.

#### Outputs

1. Potential dropout adolescents identified and demonstrate improved level of learning outcomes with specific focus on safety
2. Communities (Parents and local stakeholders) are equipped to support the adolescents to participate in education and realise their right to protection
3. School systems strengthened at the district level with support from Siksha panchayat
4. Child protection services strengthened in the districts through capacity enhancement of CPC, CWC, DCPUs, police.
5. Enabling environment for adolescent girls strengthened through continuous advocacy with district administration, political leaders, Mewat Development Board, Folk platforms.

#### Approx coverage would be

- Over all over 100,000 people across 100 villages in 4 blocks and 2 districts (Alwar and Karauli) of Rajasthan have adequate knowledge and understanding of importance of education and protection rights of Children.(age group)
- 1000 potential dropout adolescent girls and boys from 9th and 10th grade of 10 govt. Sr. Secondary Schools.
- 750 out-of-school adolescent girls associated through 10 adolescent girls learning centers.
- 3500 adolescents girls, trained on life skills, financial literacy, safety against violence and exploitation ( bad touch -good touch, sexual violence early child marriage, gender-based violence safety, and security, mental health etc) associated with adolescent collectives in the age group of 14 to 21
- 100 Panchayat level Child Protection Committees from 100 gram Panchayat
- 100 Adolescents girl collectives .

#### Strategies:

Below are some of the key strategies which will be used to bring the required changes:

1. **Contextualized and customized support to all identified potential dropouts and vulnerable children(in high school) with class-appropriate tutorial support:** High percentage of girls and boys who are irregular, low performance in Maths , Science and English in grade 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup>, keeping silence in the class during teaching -learning process and low involvement in classroom are known as potential drop out. Mapping their number and reasons are major strategies to develop a customized plan of action for such vulnerable children.
2. **Mainstream dropouts to education through adolescent girls learning centers :** Poor learning level and irregularities in class ,distance from school , regular attack on their dignity in the name of learning and physical and mental violence are major reason for drop out of adolescents girls from school. Targeted and accelerated learning help them to sustain their interest in the education and develop interest and confidence due to learning support as well as life skill session taken at adolescents learning centers . Learning centre is very important strategies to improve learning outcome of the adolescents girls for associate again with education and understanding about their life related issue. Due to support from AGLC adolescents girls mainstreaming into education through open school system .Although Open school system have unnecessary formalities which break girls mainstreaming into education .
3. **Develop and demonstrate resources and processes for building a learning and protective environment in the project areas. :** Accelerated learning process is key to the success of this project. We

have used various method and tool in past which are very successful. To further scale it up development of package of learning material and documentation of process will help in long run to do the advocacy and streamline with dept of education and Madarsa system. Development of comprehensive knowledge product / manual on accelerated learning , life skill, Safe learning environment , financial literacy will be critical comopents of the project.

4. **Capacity building and sensitization of stakeholders, on Child protection and child participation:** Knowdge and skill are to very important tool to bring the expected change among community and stakholders. Training and capacity building of stakeholders and and functionaries in child protection issue will help in overall building greater protective environment for the children. Child Protection Committes will be trained to improve the protective environment for children community.
5. **Formation and strengthening of adolescent girls' collectives:** Adolescents are the key change maker. Bring together and collecctivising them will further strengthen their voice in family and community. Through this group the can raise their concern and issue not only with family but also among other stakeholders.
6. **Life skill education for adolescent empowerment:** along with mainstreaming them in school life skill will further enhance their confidence and different prospective to address the challenges . This will bring the intergenerational changes in the society. Life skil session will be taken at school of 9<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> all girls at school campus as well as at village for member of Adolescents girls collective .
7. **Linkages with social protection scheme and networking with the government offices, CBOs like-minded, and CSOs:** Govt. is key duty bearer to address their challenges. So to reduce the vulnerability linking them with different social protection scheme will another important strategy to overcome the poverty as reason to drop out. Similiary working with other CSOs and community base platforms are important player to bring the changes in the mind set of the community and families. So orienting, training and sensitizingng them will help to leverage the greater result in short time frame.
8. **Evidence-based advocacy for the upscale of project success:** Data and information is power to convince and advocate to address the gaps and challenges. Evidence generation and evidence base advocacy is vital strategies to influence the policy makers and stakeholders. So through this project we will gather the evidence and advocate on various district and state level platform to implement comprehensive programme for adolescent

### Challenges / bottlenecks faced in the reporting period:

Girls of age group 14-18 dropout from schools from 2-3 year back and engage in some work and at the stage of child marriage . Mainstreaming of these girls again in education system are very difficult initially but due to community engagement and girls collective these girls associated with AGLC and start new journey. Potential dropout boys and girls

confidence level is very poor , they fear about their result ,they have not any interest in teaching learning process and subject specific support which they need .

### Proposed way forward in the reporting period:

Out of school adolescents girls and potential dropout students of 14-18 age group are living in difficult circumstance due to various reasons . Urgent Need to work with these age group -dropouts girls and potential dropouts boys and girls on academic support as well as life skills support including good touch -bad touch, safe and secure environment at society and institutions , violence free environment and moral support .orientation of parents and other stakeholders regarding adolescents needs so that they treat respectfully with them and support as they required .

**External and our supporters Visit in Financial year :** In 2023-24 duration our funders of UNICEF , American Jewish World Service , Ajim Prem Ji Foundation, NASIM Foundation and Taj and Zakir Syed Family charitable Foundation representative visit our field area and interact with beneficiaries including Adolescent's Girls( dropout and potential dropout girls ) , parents, college going girls ,Mewat Shiksha Panchayat members , govt. school staff as well as our staff . We learn from their visits and see impact of our work at the time of visits. This is real partnership, where we both are involve for better implementation and benefit more beneficiarie . ### Management and Governance of AMIED :

The governing board comprise of General Assembly and Executive Council. There are 11 members from all walks of life with a fair representation of females in General Assembly as well as in the executive council which consist of 7 members ,5 elected from the General Assembly itself and 3 are nominated Members . Executive council has four office bearers- Chairperson, vice-chairperson, treasurer and member secretary. The member secretary also bears the responsibility of Executive Director as chief executive head of the organization responsible for entire program and admin management. The Member Secretary is accountable to the governing council for running the organization according to the objectives of the organization, organizing board meetings and preparing progress as well as the annual financial report. Apart from this governing body the organization also has a panel of experts of 5 eminent persons who provide their technical expertise in preparing policies, projects and preparing implementing strategies.

In the administrative echelon under Executive Director, there are *Deputy Director (Program)*- accountable for the program management and implementation, Human resource management at project sites, liaison with partner

organizations and funding partners, Documentation *Co-Ordinator*- responsible for preparing reports, consolidation of field data sharing this with Deputy Director and Executive Director. *Finance Co-Ordinator* accountable for oversee the financial practices of the organization which is subordinated by Accountant and Cashier for day to day accounts keeping and financial expenses. These positions are based on the headquarters and move in the field as per requirement. Since organization implements its projects at grassroots level, *Block coordinators or Project coordinators* are appointed to ensure the effective implementation of the program, leading the block team, preparing local strategies in tune with the overall project objectives, organizing block level activities like; period meetings, stakeholder meetings, documenting the progress and challenges and reporting it periodically to the Deputy Director (Program). The Block coordinators are subordinated by the *cluster coordinators* who are responsible for implementing the program at cluster level and village level by leading a team of field workers consist of School Point Person (works with schools, takes feedback from the teachers and report to the cluster coordinator) and village level workers especially designated as per the need of a particular project and its key skills varies from project to project. These village level workers are mostly volunteers who work as real change agents and belong to the same locality and community and have reputation in their villages which help organization to implement the project components with ease and communicate effectively with the local community.
